## Neighborhood Street Clearing Program Suspended Until January 26th

The Public Works Department announces the suspension of the phased snow clearing program to respond to impending inclement weather. With the forecast weather and ice expected to come in the next day, City field crews and equipment will be needed to maintain the streets. The program to clear snow will resume on January 26. Clearing operations will continue tonight through until tomorrow at 7AM. Please observe parking restrictions until then. The City appreciates the public's understanding while Public Works strives to maintain the safety of all of the city streets.

On January 26 and January 27, snow clearing will take place in the following 2 neighborhoods; Highway 75 North (Gordon Drive, Floyd Blvd, Hwy 75 Bypass/Outer Drive) and Northside (Outer Drive, Hamilton Blvd, Floyd Blvd, Stone Park Blvd/27<sup>th</sup> St). Parking will be allowed on one side of the street for a 24 hour period (7AM to 7AM) each day. There will be parking allowed on the even numbered address side of the street only on January 26. On January 27, parking will be allowed on the on the odd side of the street only. To ensure the street is cleared, vehicles must be moved during these times. The Police Department will work closely with Field Services throughout this effort and vehicles that are not in compliance will be towed. The Downtown Near North neighborhood will be cleared on January 28th and 29<sup>th</sup>.

This effort will also allow for the access and opening of the inlets to the storm sewer system so the melted snow can drain away. City utility crews will be following the street clearing with the focus on opening all inlets in low areas that could cause flooding issues if we have a major melt or rain in the upcoming weeks. The other inlets in the areas will be addressed as time allows.

Police, Fire, and emergency personnel consider street clearing a major priority in the City as the need to get emergency vehicles, especially large fire trucks down City streets is imperative to public safety. We thank citizens for their cooperation and patience throughout this major street clearing effort. Citizens are requested to keep their vehicle off of the restricted side for the full 24 hours as City Crews may need to return for additional clearing. Citizens are reminded not to blow or push the snow from their property into the street as it delays the overall clearing effort.
